HOUSING BOSSES ATTEMPT TO EVICT GALWAY FAMILY

A single mother of three has been told to leave her home by the Galway Housing Corporation, after they recently served her with a court eviction order.

Patricia Laffey, along with her children aged six, three and one, moved into their home when her sister left it to live in England in early October, 1993. Before that Patricia was living at her parents house, in crowded and cramped conditions, while, being on the Corporations massive housing list for over five years.

The Housing Corporation got the eviction order after blaming Patricia and her children of squatting on Corporation property. However Patricia has always insisted on paying her rent to them no a weekly basis and on top of that she would even fork out to pay her sisters rent arrears. Obviously Patricia's calls of desperation, to have a roof over her and her kids heads, fell on deaf ears

Given the biased record of the Corporation's attitude towards single parents, all they had to offer Patricia and her kids was shelter at a home for 'battered wives', even though she doesn't fall into that category. homeless.

Patricia Laffey is standing her ground against these thugs who plan to evict her. Attacks such as this one against Patricia should be met with an even stronger show of force. Give us back our unions

The recent Irish Congress of Trade Unions (ICTU) conference in Derry showed just what a sham the Irish trade union movement has become.

Any attempt to discuss politics was ruled out of order, as it always is at ICTU events. This is in

keeping with the constitution of the ICTU which says that the organisation must remain non-political. For fuck sake - what is trade unionism if not political.

The idea that the trade unions are not political organisations is a lie. The Northern Ireland Committee (NIC) of the ICTU is one of the most favoured institutions of the Northern State. The NIC nominates people to numerous government bodies, in addition to receiving hugh amounts of money from the British government.

ICTU officials are often seen accompanying British ministers abroad, to promote the North to potential investors, no doubt selling the fact that the six counties has one of the lowest wage levels in the West -25% lower than those in the US.

How the hell can they call this nonpolitical. The very fact that the ICTU has such a relationship with a state, a sizeable minority of the population of which want to see destroyed, means that they are taking sides.


Due to the postal disruption which Dublin has been

IRISH CORPORATE SHARK, Michael Smurfit is often presented as a role model for the rest of us. The likes of Smurfit and Ben Dunne are presented as "captains of industry" and have the full backing of government and the national media.

What nobody is mentioning is that Smurfits success and his billion pound empire was built by ripping off working class people. There is nothing he and his fellow "captains" won't do to increase their profits.

When his pals in Fianna Fail presented him with the lucrative post as the Telecom Eireann boss, Smurfit showed just what he was capable of. The privatisation programme cost thousands of workers their jobs. Privatisation, the selling of publicly owned companies to make a quick buck, is also responsible for the huge increase in telephone costs for us. Remember the Telecom scandal? In addition to his huge salary it appears that Smurfit was also sorting out some pocket money, to the tune of millions, for him and his cronies. Smurfit resigned his post, but he faced no penalty or jail sentence and

his reputation is intact. Contrast this with the stigma which the media associates with working class scams, such as ripping of the dole or doing a nixer for a few extra bob. The message being sent out is clear - corporate crime pays.

Overseas Smurfits operations are more revealing. A seven month long strike at a Smurfit mill in Oregan, USA turned violent when the company locked out five hundred workers and brought in scab labour. One union chiefs comments sum up the anger felt;

"This is the most unbelievable company we've ever dealt with as a union, and we've dealt with the giants."

Most controversial of all is the alleged carry on in South America. In Columbia Smurfit hoods intimidated communities of Paez indians off their ancestral lands in order to plant vast pine plantations for paper pulp. The bully boy tactics back fired when the indians resisted. Events took a sinister twist when a leading Paez activist 'disappeared'. Very convenient, but probably just a coincidence?

It's reasonable to assume that little distractions such as workers safety and environmental safeguards don't concern Smurfit too much. A gas explosion at a Columbian paper mill killed three and hospitalised seventy five workers. In places where there is environmental monitoring, such as the USA, Smurfit has been fined several times for poisoning streams and other niceties. So that's what it takes to become the pride of Ireland - a willingness to smash workers rights, destroy the planet and steal land from native people. Having risen to power and wealth on the back of the Irish working class, Mr Smurfit is now resident in Monaco, so he doesn't even have to pay tax here.

Thoughhe did show his appreciation when he 'presented' a gift to the Irish people - that ugly "Floozie in the Jacuzzi" eyesore on O'Connell Street. We look forward to the day when another monument can adorn O'Connell Street. The lamp post is already there - who's got the rope?

Making room for the General

Have you heard the one about the actress and the Bishop? Of course you have - everybody has, so here's the one about the General and the singer. 'Stormin' Norman Schwarzkopf, who lead the Allied forces during the Gulf War has fallen in love with the voice of the Irish singer Susan McCann.

Susan had a tight schedule in Florida recently, but fitted in an extra performance when the General asked her nicely to play at a little gig he had organised. Schwarzkopf's high social 'charity' bash cost a mere \$5,000 a plate, with the money raised going to help paralysis sufferers.

What a caring soul is our General - who would have guessed. In 1991 the forces under his command set out to "bomb Iraq into the stone age". They did a pretty thorough job. Civilians and deserting Iraqi troops were blitzed as they tried to flee the devastation. We'll probably never know how many non-combatants men, women and children were killed. We can not even guess how many paralysis suffers were created when the 90,000 tonnes of explosives were dropped on the country.

Our advice to Susan McCann is to keep out of the Middle East you're probably not that popular there. Then again that would be just like home, wouldn't it?

In 1993 Paul Walsh, an active member of Sinn Fein, was charged with IRA membership. 

Class War is a working class revolutionary organisation. As working class people we know that this society is just not good enough for us. It is structured in such a way that it cannot function in our interests. We want this to change - we believe that a better world can be created. However, society does work in the interests of a small minority of people- the ruling class. Before we can have the better world we deserve, this parasite class and all that they stand for will have to be destroyed. This means revolution.

Society is divided into two main classes; the working class, who produce all the wealth of the world, and the ruling class, who benefit from that wealth. The power and privileged position of the ruling class depends on the subjugation of the working class. Put simply - this privileged class can only continue to exist through our continued exploitation. The bosses have always realised this and have been ruthless in their pursuit of profits, always at our expense.

Way back in 1795, Patrick Colqunoun (who is now recognised as the 'inventor of the modern police system') had this to say.

"Poverty is the most necessary and indispensable ingredient of society...it is the lot of man...it is the source of all wealth, since without poverty there would be no labour and without labour there would be no riches, no comfort and no benefit to those possessed of wealth."

We hate to agree with this bastard (even if he is dead over 200 years), but let's be honest, he really does just about say it all.

HOW DO THEY DO IT?

The ruling class represents a tiny minority (approx. 5%). In Ireland and throughout the world the majority of

people are working class. Not only do we vastly outnumber them, but it's our labour that produces the wealth of society. So how is it that they own and control it all, and more importantly, why do we let them?

The ruling class enforce their rule through naked oppression; the police, the army etc., when necessary. However, they much prefer to do so through propaganda and through control of every aspect of our lives. Their propaganda machine consists of the media, the education system, the church, so called entertainment and popular culture.

They need us to think that there can be no alternative to this society and we must never believe that we have any power to change it. A working class that realises it's own strength is their biggest fear. They understand one essential point of this class based society - they need us, we don't need them. If we, as a class, realised this and acted accordingly, then they know that they'd have reached the final chapter of their history.

They have to convince us that we are not a separate class with distinct interests of our own, in conflict with theirs. A constant feature of their propaganda is the denial of 'class'. Simultaneously they make various efforts to confuse and muddle the existing class relations. We are told that, "this is a classless society", "there's no such thing as class", that "we are all middle class now" and a wide variety of other such fairy tales. They try to convince us that with a lot of effort and just a little bit of luck anyone can make it. Many people go through life believing that success is just around the corner. Maybe it is - but would someone please tell us where the fuck that particular corner is and just how far away it is?

DIVIDE AND RULE

They know that the reality of class division is too strong for all of us to swallow their crap, so it's also essential for them to stop us working together within our class. The main tactic they use to do this, divide and rule, is as old as oppression itself. It is, so to speak, the ultimate weapon in the hands of the bosses. They create and encourage divisions amongst us; male/female, black white, Catholic/Protestant, Gay/'straight' and soon. The ideology behind these divisions is totally false, but many of our class face real discrimination as a

They try to convince us that they are naturally superior, that some people are born leaders or have some god given right to rule us, and that this is the proper order of things. They create the myth that we need them and their institutions. For example, we're expected to believe that the police protect us from crime, when in fact their true role is to defend the bosses and contain any threat to their rule (as is blatantly clear in the North).

The so called democratic process gives the illusion that we have some control over our lives. This is a con job. The institutions of state and the entire political structure are totally subservient to the needs of capitalism, with the real power and decision making resting with those who own and control the wealth..

IT'S A WAR

We have already stated that the rich fully recognise the nature of capitalist society - they know that it is us and them. We totally agree - IT'S WAR - A war between the haves and the have not, the rich and the poor, those who create the wealth of society and the parasites who live of it - A CLASS WAR. No word other than war adequately describes the violence committed against our class in their quest for profits. It is no exaggeration to say that the responsibility for all the worlds problems lies on their doorstep, from famine in Africa, widespread ecological ruin, the wars raging across the world, to the violence of our everyday lives, crime, discrimination poverty, unemployment.

Now that you've read this far you'll understand why we hate capitalism and the rich so much. You probably do too. At this stage you're probably asking, "So what are we going to do about it?".

First of all, let's get one thing clear we make no ridiculous claim to be the 'leadership' of the working class, nor will we ever. We are not just another political party or group that is seeking to win power for itself. We do not see ourselves as 'political intellectuals', who can guide the masses to victory. When it comes down to it, we, as Class War, are just a bunch of individuals who have come together to do something about the society we are forced to live in. We want to help build and be part of an independent revolutionary movement, within the Irish working class, under the control of no one but the class itself. This movement will be inspired by, and will build upon, the traditions of our class - unity, solidarity and resistance.

As long as this society exists there will always be those among our class who realise what needs to be done and will organise themselves to spread their ideas.

So what exactly is this better world we are talking about. The first and most important thing to realise is that it will be completely different than what we have now. We believe that society can be structured so as to serve the interests

what about russia?

Those who argue against socialism often point to Russia as an example of how our ideas could never work. What existed in Russia was nothing like the kind of world that we want. It is completely wrong to describe Russia as communist or socialist. It was nothing other than yet another capitalist country. The defining factor of capitalism is that production is geared towards the accumulation of profit in order to compete with rival capitalists. In Russian the centralised authority conformed with this in order to compete with the western powers. This is known as "state capitalism", as opposed to "free market capitalism".

The 1917 revolution was a genuine attempt by the Russian working class to break the shackles of capitalism. We can learn valuable lessons from their experiences and subsequent events. One of the most important of these must be that no revolution can go forward on the basis of one party seizing power and administering that power on our behalf. The experience of the Russian working class shows us that a workers revolution cannot succeed in any one country while world capitalism survives. Revolution has to be international

When the workers of the Eastern Bloc successfully smashed state capitalism we were among the first to celebrate. However we have no illusions that the "free market", which they have now, is any better. They, like us, have a long way to go.

of the vast majority of people. A society where work and production will not be subject to the chaos of capitalist profit making, but are planned by and in the interests of everyone. All decisions must be made by those who will be directly affected by them. Nobody will be granted any privilege over anyone else. People will not be divided on the basis of colour, sex or anything else.

When the motivating factors of profit and competition are removed, we can deal with the ecological destruction and the squandering of the earths resources which are the legacy of capitalism. This can only happen in a society based on co-operation and mutual consent, a truly equal and democratic society, where no individual or group leads, and where the world's more than sufficient wealth is fairly distributed. In the past different people have described this type of society in a variety of ways; Communism. Socialism, Anarchism. We just call it common sense.

TIME TO CHOOSE

Many people reading this may now be saying that this all sounds fine but in real life it just can't work. To these people we just want to point out that for generations of working class people, all over the world, capitalism has not worked. The German revolutionary, Rosa Luxemburg, once said that the choice facing humanity was one between "revolution or destitution". With the increasing problems of environmental destruction, war and economic crisis throughout the world, many people are beginning to believe that it's about time to make that decision. You know which path we have chosen.

Our enemies are ruthless and brutal in pursuit of their class interests. If we are serious about winning we must be as ruthless in our intentions and as clear headed and organised in our actions. We don't intend to lose!

It is essential that workers realise their strength as a class and that they alone possess the power to get rid of this crap once and for all. We must fight all attacks on our class and defend every gain won from our enemy, but never lose sight of our final aim - to consign the rich parasites and their poisonous system to the dustbin of history. In our struggle those who side with the enemy (scabs, cops, prison warders, etc.) are secum. They are traitors to their class and deserve to be treated as traitors are in any war!

Class War, as an organisation, will participate as equals in the struggle of the working class, constantly arguing among our class for the need to build strong organised resistance to the bosses system. We will fight along side all those who are willing to take up the fight of the working class. We reject the politics of those groups and organisations, who claim to fight on behalf of the workers, but who in reality have no genuine faith in the ability or power of our class. Real change in Ireland will come about when the working class, North and South, realise our power and use it in our interests. We are part of that class and proud of it.



HALL OF FAME

The Irish working class has a proud and inspiring history of fighting back. Time and time again we've struck out at those who would have us stay in our place. Let's take a look at *our* Hall of Fame.

Early in our history we had the struggles against rack renting landlords. This was followed by bitterly fought out trade union disputes at the beginning of the century.

1913 saw twenty thousand Dublin workers fighting the bosses of that city in the Lock Out, which led to the formation of the Irish Citizen Army, which had as it's aim the overthrow of capitalism. The Irish Citizen Army was Europe's first workers militia of the twentieth century and took part in the 1916 Rising against the worlds most powerful imperialist power.

In 1919 the workers of Limerick seized control of that town and declared in a soviet, under their direct control. This was not just a one off occurrence. Between the years 1917 and 1923 (during the War of Independence and the Civil War), land and factories were taken over and run by labourers and workers all over the country.

When news of the Russian revolution reached Ireland ten thousand workers took to the streets of Dublin to celebrate.

In Belfast in 1932 workers united to combat the grinding poverty created by the world depression. This was not the first nor last time that unity has been forged across the sectarian divide, when workers found their common cause against capitalism.

Let's not forget the international solidarity shown from 1936 to 1939, when Irish and Spanish workers fought side by side against the rise of faccism in Spain.

The Civil Rights movement in the North, which came to a head on the streets of Derry, shook the sectarian state to it's rotten foundations. The early agitation in Derry was under the slogan "Class not Creed".

"Free Derry" and other no-go zones were established. The crisis for the "Northern Irish", British and Irish ruling class was only ended when troops took to the streets.

After fourteen protesters were murdered on Bloody Sunday mass demonstrations took place in Dublin which led to the burning of the British Embassy. Because thousands of workers in the south were planning to stay away from work on the day of the funerals the Irish government was forced to call a National Day of Mourning. Had they not it would have been the biggest industrial stoppage in decades.

During the Hunger Strikes in the H-Blocks thousands mobilised to support the prisoners demands.

In the 1980's the strike at Dunnes Stores, over South African products, was an inspiration to the world. More recently, long drawn out battles for union recognition have shown that the bosses still fear our ability to organise in the work place and that workers are as willing as ever to fight to maintain that ability. And that is not the half of it. With a history like ours the ruling class are right to fear us.

Today we must look back and learn the lessons from this past. We should be proud of those who have struggled and fought before us, without being blind to the many mistakes that have been made. It is essential that we learn and progress from the successes and failures of the previous generations of revolutionaries.

The powers that be would love to deny us our proud history - they really want us to believe that the concept of a workers revolution is something alien to Ireland - imported by "godless foreigners". This terrifying condemnation was issued by a Catholic Bishop back in 1850;

"Hell is not hot enough nor eternity long enough for the miserable wretches who endeavour to root continental socialism in the soil of holy Ireland".

Scary stuffindeed. If hell is the reserve of the best fighters of our class then we're looking forward to the good company. If hellfire is created by the actions of revolutionaries then we'll be throwing some more fuel on.


the myth of the UNDERCLASS

The bosses propagandists are nothing if not inventive. They are always on the look out for new ways to divide us, and for new notions that can help complicate a straight forward analysis of conflicting class interests.

The newly developed concept of "underclass" fits the bill perfectly. This "class" is supposedly made up of those who don't and won't fit in the homeless, "criminals", the long term unemployed ("scroungers"). In effect, we're supposed to believe that those who suffer the worst excesses of capitalism, the poorest and most deprived and alienated of our class, are

inherently different from the rest of us and besides it's their own fault anyhow. We are encouraged to despise them and thank our lucky stars we're not like them. If some of us do end up "like them" it's only through our own failings. So society is divided, between the decent folk and those who don't want to fit in. This is all bollocks. There is no underclass.

The consequences of this concept being widely accepted within our class would be disastrous. Those labelled "underclass" would become increasingly alienated, the rest of the class would grow more distant from them and resentment and hostility would be mutual. The fear of slipping into the "underclass" would greatly encourage people not to rock the boat and to accept the status quo, no matter how unhappy they are about it. In a nutshell, self centred attitudes and strife within our class would increase and hostility towards the real enemy would be curbed. Just what the bosses' doctor ordered.

PIGS IN THE MIDDLE

WE HAVE already stated that there are two main classes, however there is also a third - the middle class. Their role in society is exactly as the name suggests, they act as a buffer between us and the ruling class.

They have been granted a privileged position in society in return for which they ensure everything runs smoothly for the boss class and that we toe the line. Essentially they act as middle management for capitalism. As the middleman they can have no distinct class interest as such - they only exist in relation to the other two classes. Their only aim can be to co-operate and hope that the ruling class allows them to maintain (or slightly improve) their position over us. This means that they usually ally themselves with the bosses

In revolutionary terms the middle class is pretty irrelevant some will side with us, some against us, it won't make much difference. We have full faith in our class and see no necessity in attracting or pleasing the middle

Many middle class people feel guilty about their privileges and rebel (often becoming 'right on' dogooders). This lot usually retain their arrogant and patronising attitudes, and often see themselves as intellectually superior. Basically they try to live out their middle class roles in guilt free, alternative ways. They can fuck off right now they are unnecessary and unwelcome.

Some will genuinely side with us. They can only do this as our equals. Many of our class will distrust them (and rightly so, as the 'authority figures' we come up against in everyday life are mostly middle not ruling class) - they'll have to accept this. The bottom line is that they usually have the option to comfortably drop out of the struggle - we don't - we were bom into it.

have to pay more for it. The Fingal and Dublin South councils are both going to slap a £85-£70 charge on working class families for using water. While a service charge of roughly the same amount is looming over the heads of the residents in the corporation districts. The minister for

the environment. Michael 'Sleaze Bag' Smith and council managers are vowing to bring Dublin into line with the rest of the country.

To the ruling elite and their political puppets our class is only selectively useful. We're allowed produce their profits with our labour, but when it comes to

Areas in Dublin South have a good history of community solidarity and this will make non-payment more consistent. If the government ever does build the Tallaght hospital then what better way to open it than to throw the councillors through the doors of casualty head first.

SERVICE CHARGE

The city manager, Frank Feely, is proposing to charge all households in Dubin for the services provided by the Corporation. A quick look at these services shows just how our money will be wasted. Ballymun is a prime example, it has it's own rent system separate from the rest of the corporation estates. This is because heating is meant to be provided by the council and paid for through the rent. Last year bureaucratic burkes in the



corpo had the heat set too high, resulting in tenants having to leave windows open as the heat was unbearable. When people asked why they couldn't control the heat individually they were told it was because they would have it on all the

The stupidity didn't stop there - it got worse. This year the heating is on too low and too little. The corporation have had the nerve to put the rent up, claiming that it is to pay for the extra heat.that they are now providing - a total lie. When tenants questioned them on the lack of heating they were accused of leaving windows open and wasting heat. But the Ballymun saga doesn't even end there. After many years of fighting for better conditions in the tower blocks and in the estates, the corpo decided to act. They are doing up one tower block and are trying to make the residents pay for for it. Faceless bureaucrats are making the working class people of Thomas McDonagh tower pay for improving the dereliction and neglect they have suffered for years, by doubling their rent. Many single parents have already gone into rent arrears because of this. This is the sort of service they would have us pay more for.

We have no option but nonpayment. Our class should fight any service charges bitterly. As for the councillors, they'll begin to feel the real heat if they dare to canvass our estates during the next election.

The working class people of Waterford, and how they treated new charges, are an example worth following. Despite numerous attempts to make them pay they have successfully fought off new charges every time, through militant community action. Despite mass nonpayment by residents the Waterford council decided to cut off water supplies. But this proved unworkable when whole estates came out in solidarity and physically prevented workmen from carrying out their task. The gardai could do nothing to carry out the councils dirty work. Even when water supplies were cut off, it wasn't long before a plumber would come and reconnect it. The end result was that every time round the council

Water rates and service charges have always proved to be a sore point with our class and we're sure that our proud history of militant opposition to them will not be left behind, but looked upon for inspiration, as the battle heats up.



"THE BAD INSPECTOR"

Last year the Irish censor banned "The Bad Lieutenant", a film about a particularly disgusting cop. In one scene he exposes himself and abuses two young women. Maybe this was too close to the truth. Recently, an RUC inspector, Raymond Lindsay, was jailed for sixteen offences against schoolgirls aged between eleven and seventeen. He sat in his car, half naked, reading porn mags before calling girls over and exposing himself to them. He also assaulted six girls he picked up coming home from school. The most revealing aspect of the whole case was that Lindsay was a "rising star" in the force, with high promotion potential. He'd become an inspector within six years of joining.

Masterminds of the Right

Emily O'Reilly - Attic Press - £7.99

If anyone has any illusions about the various "Pro-life", Pro-family" groups and thinks that they are well intentioned but misguided, then this book is an essential read. It shows how group such as SPUC, Family Solidarity etc. originated and how they operate. Let's just say they're not nice people. Particular attention is given to one individual, John O'Reilly, and it is clearly illustrated how he and his cronies have made their right wing agenda a central part of Irish political life, and created a totally false sense of 'public opinion'.

Fascinatingly eye opening are the details on the Knights of Columbanus. This is basically Ireland's own Catholic secret service. Their immediate aim is to infiltrate and dominate institutions and groups throughout the country, to further their ultimate goal of the creation and maintenance of a Catholic state for a Catholic people. As John O'Reilly (a member of the Knights) puts it; "The order has members in many places and walks of life and in positions of influence", and he further observes, "An organisation or a group is never more powerful than when it influences events without itself being regarded as the initiator."

Despite the prominent involvement of many individuals who do not quite fit the bill, the Irish far right is not just a collection of sad arsed individuals and loonies. There is indeed method in their madness. They have a clear and precise agenda. This book clearly and concisely shows all this and details their activities through the 70's, 80's and right up to the X-case (1992).

On its initial release this slim volume was vastly over priced at £8, but it's now widely available in bargain book shops at half price or less. A very informative read, so look out for it.

FLEXIHEAD - Single - Voice Box Pox Records

Flexihead are a three man outfit that look likely to go places or at least deserve too. They have a powerful sound with a strong base and some very original hardcore riffs. They've just released their debut three track, seven inch - "Mine", Nervous", "Scars", which has attracted a good bit of attention. We reckon that unlike many Irish hardcore bands, with the

exception of FUAL and Cúnas, that they're here to stay. Too many hard core bands have been getting into the rut of churning out at worst old covers and at best new songs to the same over played styles. NE ROAD T The initial optimism about the

chances of a end to violence in the North, which was so prevalent in the media following the announcement of the Downing Street Declaration, now seems to have faded. But does this document really offer a chance of peace? After all there was very little in it that the British had not said before.

The Declaration cannot bring peace to the six counties because it does not tackle the real cause of the violence the existence of the sectarian state of Northern Ireland'.

The violence, which the working class of the North have to live with, is a direct result of the partition of Ireland and the setting up of an artificial state whose founding principles were discrimination and bigotry. By

remaining in the North Britain is adding to the causes of violence. The Brits must go and the border must be removed.

We do not say this because we are nationalists or republicans. Class War believes that it is in the interests of the entire working class of this country to fight to build a united socialist Ireland.

The type of 'United Ireland' which republicans and nationalists are looking for has very little to offer workers, north or south. Their aim is simply to remove the British and end partition, while leaving in place the economic system which ultimately is the cause of the problem in the first place. This offers little to either the workers of the south or the protestant section of the working class in the

north. Unless there is something on offer which can deliver a better standard of living, better health care, good quality housing, etc. there is little chance of winning the majority of our class, and that must include the Protestants of the North, over to a position of fighting to end partition.

PAN-NATIONALISM

Recently the Republican Movement has been talking quite a bit about the need for all the nationalist forces to act with more unity of purpose. They are looking for the SDLP, the Irish Government and themselves to form a pan-nationalist agreement which could then put pressure on Britain. This type of cross class unity can lead nowhere.

Danny Morrison of Sinn Fein once stated that, "The south holds the key". If this is true then how the hell can you build any support among the workers of the south when you are pandering to the very bosses who are responsible for the unemployment, low wages and poverty that those very workers are suffering.

The reason that Sinn Fein do not

look to the working class of the south is because when they say that the south holds the key, they really mean that the southern government holds the key.

Sinn Fein are nationalists. They do not look to the working class to solve the problem of partition because they do not believe in the power of the working class - the do not believe in working class unity.

If there is ever to be a movement which can seriously break down the sectarianism of the north, it can only be a movement which is based on class. It is when workers look at where their class interests are, that they can be won away from sectarianism and towards building an Ireland that is worth fighting for.

In 1985 Patrick McLaughlin, like so many unemployed men from Derry, went to England to find work so that he could support his wife and four children, Instead of finding a job, he is now serving a life sentence for a crime he did not commit.

He was convicted of "conspiring to cause an explosion" The bomb, found ouiside the Chelsea Army Barracks in London, was claimed by the INLA, who have repeatedly said that Patrick McLaughlin was not one of their members. The case against Patrick is that he was supposedly in a flat in Hariesden. London when a bomb was being made. Patrick was at a party in the flat the night before the explosives were found. The police claimed that a finger print on a bin-liner which was wrapped around the bag was Patrick's. In court they were unable to identify where this print was, as they said the identification sticker had been lost'.

A magazine with his name on it was found in a van which the cops say was used to transport the bomb. Patrick says that he had left the magazine and another at the Harlesden flat. It is extremely unlikely that a member of the INLA on a bombing mission would sign his name on a magazine and then leave it where cops could find it.

Police claim that he had an incriminating conversation with an officer in which he said he was aware of a bomb being made in the flat on the night of the party. Patrick denies this. The officer concerned admitted that he had not asked Patrick who had been making the bomb and another officer said that he had never heard Patrick say anything about a bomb being made.

Five people at that flat were arrested by police and later released. Patrick was arrested some weeks later by the RUC in Derry. He had returned home when his money ran out, after being unable to find work.

Key withness who could have given evidence in support of Patrick's innocence did not appear at the trial. Police claimed that two of them were in Ireland and one in America, but that they were unwilling to give evidence because of alleged threats.

The judge at the trial spent ten hours emphasising the prosecution case but only two on the defence. He also allowed the introduction of unrelated 'evidence' which was likely to have a detrimental effect of Patrick's defence. For example he allowed the prosecution to state that Patrick had "IRA" roughly tattooed on his arm - as "proof" that he was an IRA supporter.

Patrick McLaughin is yet another innocent working class Irish person who has become the victim of a British system of justice which is rotten to the core. He deserves al! our support.



Despite last years referendum results the government has made no attempt to make abortion information available, so this pamphlet, compiled by the Women's Information Network (WIN) is an essential release. As the name suggests, this is basically a guide for any pregnant women and details all the options available, from keeping the child (including social welfare and employment rights), through adoption and abortion. Also included is information on contraception and sexually transmitted diseases. The most useful section is four pages of addresses and phone numbers, detailing every organisation in Ireland which provides information and support for women. Every home should have a copy.
