It is unlike all established Irish parties; it is structured differently, makes decisions differently, advocates very different policies and is working towards a very different kind of society.

The Green Alliance offers an alternative to the conventional parties which are short-sightedly taking Ireland (and the world) down the road to social, economic and biological disaster. In recent years similar organisations have appeared in other European countries (notably West Germany); they are increasingly referred to as Green Parties.

The Green Alliance originally called the Ecology Party of Ireland was founded in December 1981. It has contested the 1982 General Election, 1984 Euro Election, the 1985 Local Elections and the 1987 General Election. The Local Elections gave us our first success – a member elected to the Killarney U.D.C.

The Green Alliance/Comhaontas Glas has adopted these seven principles by consensus:

- 1 The impact of society on the environment should not be ecologically disruptive.
- 2 Conservation of resources is vital to a sustainable society.
- 3 All political, social and economic decisions should be taken at the lowest effective level.
- 4 Society should be guided by self-reliance and co-operation at all levels.
- 5 As caretakers of the Earth, we have the responsibility to pass it on in a fit and healthy state.
- 6 The need for world peace overrides national and commercial interests.
- 7 The poverty of two thirds of the world's family demands a redistribution of the world's resources.

Dear Friends,

Welcome to our Environmental Emergency Conference.

The conference, which is part of a nationwide awareness campaign, comes as an urgent response to the ever-increasing destruction of our environment, highlighted this year by the series of water pollution incidents.

The situation in Ireland with regard to pollution of inland water is now critical, with over one quarter of monitored rivers polluted and half of our larger lakes receiving excessive amounts of nutrients from industrial, agricultural and domestic sources. Recently, the extent of groundwater pollution previously considered minimal, has been revealed to be alarmingly high. Though we may be tempted to console ourselves with glib references to the more extensive pollution problems in Europe, there is, in fact, little comfort when a consideration of our relatively small population size puts the extent of the Irish problem in its proper perspective. We have one of the worst per capita pollution problems in Europe.

To most of us who are concerned about matters environmental, the need to protect the environment against the abuse of a minority is a matter of received wisdom and each of us will have our own reasons why environmental protection should be a priority. However, those with the power to formulate an appropriate political response to the challenge of pollution will be swayed only by pragmatic arguments, if at all. Fortunately, the call for a more responsible attitude to the environment makes sense on human health and economic as well as on philosophical grounds.

We hope that this conference will provide an adequate forum for the presentation of reasonable arguments on most aspects of pollution and pollution risk in Ireland. During the conference all contributions will be recorded, and it is hoped that resolutions will be passed, to be acted upon later by our politicians, some of whom will also be in attendance. It is clear that they, and all of us, must act now if a crisis is to be averted.
