#### I.S.U. MEETINGS

The Dublin ISU and the National Co-Ordinating Committee meet at the Arts Society building, College Lane, Westland Row every Sunday afternoon at 3.00.p.m. friends and associates are welcome to attend as observers. Other ISU groups throughout Ireland are arranging for regular, public meetings in their own areas, details will be given in October's Grapevine.

## "STUDENT SAY":

The ISU's Editorial board has been extremely busy over the past few weeks, articles have been commissioned, written, collected and edited. As Grapevine goes to press SAY is being laid out and it will be printed in the near future. The ISU Publications department - YouthComm - hope to publish SAY on Friday, September 15th. While the majority of articles in Student SAY will reflect the opinions of the union as a whole, provision has been made for articles that will reflect nothing more than the opinions of individual students. As a publication SAY will be non-profit making, it was decided in the early summer that the union should not 'carry' the paper and neither should the paper 'carry' the union. The purpose of SAY is to promote ISU and its policies as well as providing an interesting and, it is hoped, entertaining publication.

#### A SECOND I.S.U. MAGAZINE ...

The Editorial board has approved a proposal for a second magazine. This magazine will be smaller than SAY and it will be a strictly internal publication. It will NOT represent the opinions of ISU but will rather provide a platform for individual students to voice their opinions. Its purpose will be to stimulate discussion and create awareness inside the union and among students as a whole. Neither the name nor the printing schedule of the magazine have yet been decided, further details will be given in October's Grapevine.

# I.S.U's FIRST NATIONAL DELEGATE MEETING :

ISU will be holding its first national delegate meeting in Belfast on the weekend of September 23rd. - 24th. All ISU branches and groups have been notified and it is hoped that delegates from three of the six and seven of the twenty-six counties will attend. There has been some difficulty in obtaining a venue in Belfast for a weekend meeting but this has now been overcome, accommadation will be provided free to all delegates. # EUROPEAN YOUTH SECURITY CONFERENCE : HELSINKI, FINLAND

The 1972 European Youth Security Conference was held in Helsinki, Finland from the 27th. - 31st. of August. ISU were invited to send a delegate by our Finnish counterparts - the STL-Because of a lack of finance ISU were unable to send a delegate despite repeated requests from the STL. Instead ISU appointed Mr. M. Collins, one of the four Irish delegates, to act on our behalf. We hope that as well as furthering the hopes of European youth for a lasting peace and re-affirming youth's opposition to facism, injustice and repression, closer ISU/STL and closer Irish/Scandinavian links will result from the conference. ISU are dissapointed at the poor coverage given to this important conference by the Irish media.

Again the talks centered round the ISU's Reform Policy. Mr. Sheehan pointed out that it made the VEC's task easier if they knew what the students wanted and that the easiest way of doing this was if the students spoke with one voice through an organisation, (i.e. ISU).
