We must organise mass pressure for the Dublin Government to take a hard line with Westminster, seeking international support through the U.N. It is clear that civil rights are incompatible with Unionism. Dublin must demand the withdrawal of British troops, disarming and disbanding of the "B" Specials and an All-Ireland Election under U.N. supervision.

The 'solution' to the Irish question imposed by the Government of Ireland Act lies in ruins, Some new arrangement must be set up.

If the Irish people do not act in unity, this will be a politicians' arrangement, maintaining partition and perhaps bringing Dublin and Stormont under a Council of Ireland with Westminster involved. In other words, back to "mother England."
